125 Years....125 Stories

As part of our yearlong anniversary celebration, in each bulletin there will be some facts and historical curiosities about our parish and the people who have shaped our heritage for the past 125 years. If you have any stories or remembrances, please contact Jean in the parish office or Fr. Justin. So let's count down to number 1!

#110: Fr. Raphael Fuhr, our 2nd assistant (1889-1889), was a Franciscan priest from Germany, who saved the life of a coachman in Illinois when his team of horses went out of control in the 1890's. He died as a priest of the Diocese of Los Angeles, California.

#109: Fr. Joseph Gaydusek, our 3rd & 8th assistant (1892-1893; 1902-1903), eventually made his way to the Diocese of Fargo, North Dakota, where his brother was also a priest. It was not uncommon in those days, especially for ethnic priests, to go from state to state to minister to people in their own language.

#108: Fr. Adam Szymkiewicz, our 4th assistant (1893-1893), built the first St. Joseph Church in Dubois and later was pastor of Ascension Church on the North side of Pittsburgh for 25 years (1910-1935).
