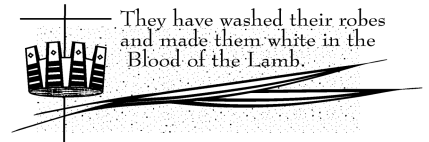

## From The Desk of Msgr. Riccardo

Dear Parishioners,

This coming weekend, May 1, our third graders will receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and May 2, our high school juniors will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Donald W. Trautman. Both Sacraments are cause for celebration in our parish. Sacraments are conferred on individuals but they affect the whole community. The graces of the Sacraments strengthens the person to do the "work of the Lord" in community.



First Communion is considered one of the holiest and most important occasions in a Catholic's life. It means that person has received the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the body and blood of Jesus Christ.

There's more to a child's First Communion than a pretty white dress and a family party. While it is a cause for celebration, that's not what the occasion is about. The event means that the children have studied and understood, to the best of their abilities, the mystery of transubstantiation, the changing of the substance of ordinary bread and wine into the substance of Christ's body and blood. A child should also be able to tell the difference between Eucharistic bread and regular food.

### The Effects of the Sacrament of Confirmation:

The Sacrament of Confirmation confers special graces of the Holy Spirit upon the person being confirmed, just as such graces were granted to the Apostles on Pentecost. Like Baptism, therefore, it can only be performed once, and Confirmation increases and deepens all of the graces granted at Baptism.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists five effects of Confirmation:

- it roots us more deeply as children of God
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross.

Let us join together in prayer for our young people and for our parish community. May the Lord continue to bless us with devoted "children of God."

### MONSIGNOR HERMAN C. WIENKER, founding pastor of SSCD...



The body of Msgr. Wienker has been moved from St. Catherine's Cemetery to his resting place at Calvary Cemetery in Punxsutawney. As part of our anniversary year of celebration we have returned Monsignor's body to his first parish. In 1885, Msgr. Wienker founded SSCD. It is only appropriate that his final resting place be here.

On Tuesday, **April 27<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm** at Calvary Cemetery, we will bless his new gravesite with a Memorial Mass. **Rev. Ed Lohse**, chancellor of our Diocese, will be the main celebrant and homilist. Please join us at the cemetery (**bring your own chair**), followed by a reception at Wienker Hall.
