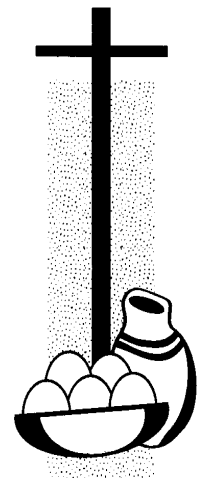

Dear Parishioners,

“One thing is needed.”

Now as they went on their way, he entered a village; and a woman named Martha received him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving; and she went to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things; one thing is needful. Mary has chosen the good portion, which shall not be taken away from her."

#44 John Christie was the fourth deacon to serve our parish from 1973 - 1974. He was ordained at St. Peter Cathedral in Erie by Bishop Alfred M. Watson on May 17, 1974.

#43 Christopher Hamlett, who served as deacon of our parish from 1982 - 1983, spent a number of his priestly ministry years in education at both Cathedral Preparatory School for Boys from 1990 - 1995 and the Mathematics Dept at Gannon University from 1996 - 2003. He is currently pastor of three parishes in McKean County: St. Raphael, Eldred; St. Theresa, Shinglehouse; and St. Mary, Sartwell.
